

How to Study for a Science Test

NOTE: You can only begin studying after you have completely read all assigned reading which was assigned in class. At the completion of the assigned reading, you should have asked yourself what you have read. If you didn't know, then you should have re-read.

1. Study your notes. Read each lettered section. Ask yourself what the topic is about. Most, but not all, of the test questions will come from your notes.
2. Re-read all captions under all pictures and diagrams in the chapter. Usually there is at least one question on the test that shows you a diagram or picture from the chapter.
3. Review the green **“Target Your Reading”** page at the beginning of the chapter.
4. Review/Study the green **“Reading Guide”** which explains what you should have learned and lists the vocabulary at the beginning of each lesson in the chapter. **Vocabulary is high-lighted** in the lesson. The blue **titles** and red **sub-titles** are found in your notes.
5. Review/Study the **“Standards Study Guide”** at the end of each chapter. Also answer the **“Standards Review”** and **“Standards Assessment”**. I will provide you with the correct answers after you try the questions. These questions are very similar to the test.
