

How to Study for a Social Studies Test

NOTE: You can only begin studying after you have completely read all assigned reading which was assigned in class. At the completion of the assigned reading, you should have asked yourself what you have read. If you didn't know, then you should have re-read. The essential and review questions help you check your comprehension.

1. Re-read the summaries of each lesson found in the [Reading Study Guide](#). Ask yourself the essential question which appears in *italics* for each summary. Cover the review question with your hand and see if you can answer it. If you can't answer these re-read. You should have written the correct review question answer when we discussed it in class.
2. Study the Vocabulary found in the “**Terms and Names**” section of each lesson in the [Reading Study Guide](#).
3. Review the answers, which you've copied during class discussion, to the questions at the end of the chapter in the [Reading Study Guide](#).
4. Re-read and study all diagrams, pictures, and maps found in the chapter. There are usually several questions asking you to interpret a map or diagram on the test.
5. Go to www.classzone.com and use the flip cards for the vocabulary from each lesson. Study the lesson outlines and take the chapter quiz which is similar to the test questions found on the test.
