1. Dresses may not be cut below the bust line.

3. Midriffs will not be exposed. (This includes both front and side.)



#4 Dresses may not have a slit that exceeds mid-thigh and skirts must reach fully extended finger tip length .



DRESS CODE

Current examples of inappropriate dress include, but are not limited to, the following clothing, attire, apparel and accessories.

DANGEROUS, DISRUPTIVE, PROVOCATIVE OR REVEALING

SUGGESTING/PROMOTING STREET GANG AFFILIATION OR OTHER UNLAWFUL ACTIVITIES

Any combination of clothing which, upon guidance from law enforcement agencies, is considered gang-related (these may change, i.e. bandanas, hair nets, metal belt buckles with gang-style monograms, dangling belts, chain accessories, slippers). Also prohibited is any reference to illegal or controlled substances.

RAVE PARAPHERNALIA - Per district policy, no glow sticks, glowing mouthpieces, beads, flashing lights or pacifiers will be allowed into the dance. If paraphernalia emerges during the dance, paraphernalia will be confiscated.

GENERALLY, if you look in the mirror and you can see parts or all of your underwear, you need to change your clothes before you come to school/events. Bare midriffs, low cut tops, halter tops, spaghetti straps that leave bra straps showing, swimwear, and muscle shirts that show “too much muscle” are not allowed. If you exhibit wisdom in your dress choices, infractions will be of little or no consequence.

If you have even the slightest question as to whether or not a certain style of dress is acceptable – ASK beforehand.

This seems a far more wise choice than risking being sent home from an IHS event you’ve been anticipating.

Students who come to school inappropriately dressed will face disciplinary measures, which include:
Wearing a “loaner” shirt and issuance of two (2) hours of detention
Possible parent contact to deliver appropriate attire to school

DANCE CODE

The following behaviors are prohibited:

Any action that could be construed as “freaking”
Riding, straddling or grinding in any way
Sexually suggestive front to back dancing
Dancing in a bent over position

(After 1 Warning) Violation of this Dance Code will result in:

Immediate removal from the dance
Future dance privileges being revoked
Parent contact
No refund of ticket expense
