

Parking Bulletin!!

Traffic congestion before and after school, as many of you are aware, continues to be a challenge for us at Lakeside. To help alleviate the traffic congestion, we ask that you use our drop-off and pick-up zone at the Stone Creek side of our campus. You can also use any of our other drop off areas, including the Lemongrass entrance as we mentioned below. Our Lakeside security officer is usually in front of the school on Lemongrass directing traffic or on the Stone Creek entrance supporting drop-off and pick-up of students. You may have seen him urging drivers to drop-off and move on so other cars can move up to the curb. If you are in the line waiting either to drop-off or pick-up your child, please consider letting them out to walk the short distance to our campus, or, at the end of the day, asking them to look for you in line so they can meet you at your car. This is really important to keep traffic from backing up.

Please, no U turns in front of the school at either entrance!



If you use the Stone Creek entrance, there are no driveways to block when you wait in line. This is much more “community friendly” as some of our local residents need to use their driveways in the morning to get to work. If you use the Lemongrass entrance, turn right on Nighthawk or right on Heron as you enter Lemongrass from Yale Loop. Turning right will put you in position to drop-off or pick-up your youngster on the right side of the street and eliminate students having to cross the street during peak traffic periods, which is a safety hazard for students.

We strongly urge you to car pool with other students who may live in your neighborhood. Other options are to ask your children to walk from home or to drop them off at the corner of Yale Loop and Lemongrass or even use the field area to pick-up and drop-off students. Each of these alternatives will reduce the volume of cars waiting in line at the beginning and end of school. With your cooperation and support of using these alternative pick-up areas, we will be able to ease the crunch of cars during the morning and afternoon rush and keep our kids safe.
